

Amy Kipp of Richfield lost her job, and facing a difficult job market made a bold deci-

Kenneth Caudill said he worked about 10 years for a company in Baltimore that makes aircraft parts before he lost his job. He decided to come north to York to get an associate's degree in computer aided drafting and design.

Now, he works for a company in Fredrick, Md.

"If you're willing to put the time and effort into it, you're going to get something out of it," he said of his decision to go back to school.

Ever since she was a child, she's loved motorcycles. She told her fiance, Jeremiah Campbell, that she was going back to school to become a motorcycle mochanic

"He might have fallen over if he hadn't already been sitting in a chair," she told the nearly 130 fellow graduates of the York Technical Institute during Wednesday's commencement at the Strand-Capitol Performing Arts Center in

But Campbell and others around her supported her through 90-minute commutes to classes in York Their patience eventually led to her being hired at Appalachian Harley-Davidson in Silver Spring Township, Cumberland County.

has been a male-dominated industry," said Michael Marino, campus president of the school's Motorcycle Technology Center, when he introduced Kipp. "However, there are a growing number of women who don't believe in the status quo."

After the ceremonies, Campbell admitted, "I thought she was crazy. I really did," when Kipp decided to return to school. He said he worried during the first semester. But

he's "amazed" at what she accomplished and quickly added, "I knew she possessed the skills to do it." Keynote speaker Louis Castriota Jr., president and chief executive officer of Leg Up Farm in Mount Wolf, described his own experience overcoming hardship. His daughter, Brooke, was diagnosed with cognitive and motor function delays in the late 1990s, launching Castriota and his family on a journey that would culminate with the opening of Leg Up, a farm that provides services to kids with special proofs.

Other graduates told similar stories of careers that ended abruptly in the economic down-

Carla Horn, president of the York campus, said the average age of the graduating class was about 25, and only 28 of the graduates were younger than 21. The oldest was 59.

"We all have a choice in life," he told the graduates. "We can look only at our obstacles, or we can look at our gifts."
