

YTI lends a helping hand

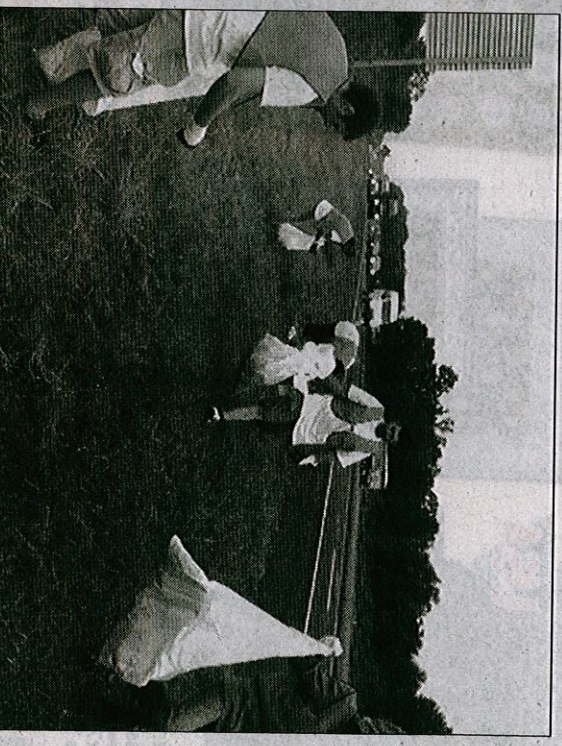
